## The World Around Us

(Science, Geography and History)



Our theme for Term 3 is **Farming**, which focuses on the importance farming has in our lives, including food and produce and how they travel from **Farm to Fork**. This theme introduces children to Farming in Ireland and will provide them with an understanding of the history of farming and how life on the farm has changed in the modern day, with an aim to inspire an appreciation for the vital role that agriculture plays in our society.

The development of farming in Ireland will be our focus, looking at the evolution from traditional practices to modern techniques. A key focus will be on the advancements in technology and how these improvements have revolutionised farming, enhancing productivity and sustainability. We will take a closer look at our local area, specially Glenravel and County Antrim, to identify and learn about the diverse types of farms that contribute to our agricultural landscape.

Primary 5 will take on an exciting STEM challenge, where they will design and create a tractor using recycled materials, allowing them to use numeracy to design their tractor to scale, calculating measurements as they bring their tractor ideas to life. The children will look at friction as they will be given the opportunity to test their tractor on different surfaces; as they learn how friction is a force that works against a moving object and makes it slow down.

Our learning will be connected to Literacy with the children researching and writing a biography of Harry Ferguson, a pivotal figure in the development of farm machinery, as well as crafting a report on Armagh, known as the Orchard County. The writing tasks will not only enhance the pupils writing skills but will also deepen their knowledge of local history and agricultural practices.

This term in:

**Maths Mastery:** In our Maths Mastery this term the Year 5 children will be focusing on

- Area and perimeter
- Solving Measure and Money Problems
- Shape and Symmetry
- Position and Direction
- 3D Shapes

In Mental Maths, we will begin to revise some of the topics we have covered already this year. It is important to keep revisiting these areas to make sure that everyone has still retained this knowledge and understanding. Please work on the Mental Maths focus each week with your child, as it will be tested in our Friday Check-ups.

**Literacy:** I am proud of the children's efforts with Accelerated Reader in Term 1 and Term 2. As a school, we urge each child to try to increase their quiz accuracy and percentage score. This ensures deep understanding of the content read. We continue to learn and use our cursive handwriting style and the children are really embracing this challenge.

**ICT:** In Term 3, children will get the opportunity to use Microsoft Word and begin to make their own Powerpoint presentations about an aspect of farming.

**PE:** Primary 5 will be starting our swimming block on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> April, with PE on a Wednesday. Please wear trainers on that day.

What else is happening this term?

**Take Five:** Our children's wellbeing continues to be an important feature of the school curriculum. This term we will be continuing to **connect**, to **learn**, to be **active**, to take **notice** and to **give** to promote wellbeing. Our Take 5 is incorporated into our daily life in the classroom, and we will take a particular focus on appreciating our local area through our topic of Farming.

### **Shared Education:**

Primary 5 will continue our Shared Education with Camphill Primary School with two face to face visits and two online art sessions together. We are looking forward to all our upcoming Shared Education activities.
